What is a Central Committee & Why Attend a Convention?

The “Central Committees” for the Clark County Republican Party (CCRP) and the Nevada Republican Party (NRP) are the steering groups that do the heavy lifting for the political parties, including creation of party platforms, fundraising and support of candidates. Anyone who is a registered Republican is a member of the Party; but she or he is not part of the central committee. To be a member of the “central committee” requires the person to do certain things. To be part of the Clark County Republican Central Committee (CCRCC), the person needs to sign up at one of the CCRCC meetings, be a member of the party, and attend two consecutive CCRCC meetings, which take place every other month at the Silverton Casino. The CCRCC meetings are open to all registered Republicans, but only CCRCC members can vote at the meetings. David Sajdak is the CCRP Chairman.

The Nevada Republican Party (NRP) oversees and coordinates with the CCRCC and the central committees of the other 16 Nevada counties. The Nevada Republican Central Committee (NRCC) is the main body overseeing NRP operations and consists of Republicans representing all 17 Nevada counties. The NRCC provides guidance and rules to the counties for the Presidential Preference Poll(caucus) and coordinates party and election activities throughout the state. Members of the NRCC are chosen by the individual counties and is based on the number of registered Republicans in the county, with each county having a minimum of five members. Clark County is allowed about 160 members who are elected from the membership of the CCRCC. The NRCC meets twice a year at various locations around Nevada; it offers a great opportunity to meet people from throughout Nevada and to see parts of our state most of us don't travel to frequently. The current chairman is Michael McDonald.

On June 6, the CCRP will hold its convention to create a party platform and to elect delegates to the Nevada Republican State Convention, to be held on June 12-13, 2020. At the Nevada Republican State Convention, the delegates will approve the state party platform, which lists goals and positions of all Nevadans and, this year, elect the delegates to the Republican National Convention. We encourage all our members to join the CCRCC and the NRCC. Success in our elections requires all of us to be involved, not only during the election cycles but throughout the entire year. This is a great way to help our Republican candidates get their word out and to inform and to motivate Republicans all across our state to vote. All it takes is your time, energy, and ideas to make Nevada RED.

Recommendations for Contested Judicial Races

Since 1981, the Nevada Republican Club (NRC) has brought conservatives together to educate our members on current issues and policies and to promote sound, honest & ethical government at all levels. As Judicial races are nonpartisan, the NRC recommends a slate of judicial candidates based on the candidate's experience, competence, integrity, honesty, and courtroom demeanor. The Club measured these qualities based on interviews of, and opinions and recommendations from, (i) conservative, practicing attorneys in family and state district courts and (ii) courtroom insiders (including court clerks and administrators). We also reviewed any available videotaped debates of the judicial candidates hosted by the Las Vegas Review Journal. We reviewed the candidate's Mardindale-Hubbell rating, website, and caseload to determine their expertise and experience. In two races, the Club declined to make a recommendation, because, in our opinion, the candidates are equally qualified.
