We are happy to report that the Club engaged in a very successful walking campaign to get our judicial "rack" cards into the community. A dozen or so members personally delivered the cards to various businesses and residents, resulting in the distribution of approximately 24,000 cards. **Except for two judicial races, all of our recommended judicial candidates made it to the General Election in November.** In addition to distributing the "rack" cards in person, the Club published the "rack" card in notable publications and news outlets, including Vegas Voice, Las Vegas Chinese Daily News, the Veterans News Reporter and the Wayne Allyn Root Show. In addition to educating the community, the "rack" cards stimulated interest in Club membership and our membership numbers increased during the Covid-19 quarantine.



Once we receive the final primary results, we will be distributing a "rack" card for the General Election. I've spent the past 14 years teaching at inner city public schools. Most of my teaching career has been in kindergarten. Every Spring, my students are expected to write a persuasive essay. The class is to asked convince their readers to choose one profession And every spring, the overwhelming majority of my class write about the responsibilities of a police officer.

Over the past decade, my former students have shared personal accounts in support of their early childhood heroes. Their stories always leave me in tears. They've all shared why their first encounter with their childhood heroes was so impactful. My students have been forced to dial 911 after their mother, sister, and/or grandparent has been assaulted. Some learned how to call for help from a female family member. Others recalled instructions they've learned during school assemblies. All of the stories ended with my students and the other victims being safe. Career Day is one of the most anticipated events for my class. I can depend and rely on my students with family members in law enforcement to volunteer. Not only do the officers wow my class with their freshly pressed uniforms and warm smiles. They also provide my class with the most engaging read alouds. By the story's end, all 24-five year olds are sitting at an officer's feet, who has also made himself at home on our classroom rug. In addition to captivating my indefatigable class, police officers gladly accept last minute requests from neighboring classrooms. Despite their challenging schedules, they spend the day making their rounds and forging long term bonds with students. Since relocating to Las Vegas last summer, I've greet and thanked every member of LVMPD I encounter. I have attended Best of the Badge of Honor Gala and the Annual Luncheon with the Sheriff. and I am inviting all Club members to attend well. Over the past three months, LVMPD has been a consistent and calming presence in my neighborhood -- always wearing a permanent, yet genuine smile and always displaying the utmost patience that this kindergarten teacher strives to one day achieve. To the officers of the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department, words cannot begin to express my gratitude. Thank you for all that you do. Thank you for being superheroes.

What is the Thin Blue Line Flag?



The "Thin Blue Line" American flag represents law enforcement and is flown to show support for the men and women who put their lives on the line every day to protect us. This symbol is hailed as the proud sign for promoting compassion and support for our nation's police officers. The phrase "The Thin Blue Line" is synonymous with "Police" and "Law Enforcement" and can be used interchangeably. It is the "Line" in "Line of Duty." In visual terms, it is found in one of two variations. The first is a simple, centered blue line with black space above and below it. The second, as a single blue stripe on an otherwise black and white, American flag, located just below the stars. So, what does it mean? In both versions, the black space above the blue line represents society, order and peace, while the black below, crime, anarchy, and chaos. The Thin Blue Line running between them, "law enforcement," separates the two, keeping crime separated from society. When placed in the context of a flag, there is an added element of patriotism and, as illustrated in the video above, the stars symbolize the citizens who benefit from the sacrifice of our heroes on the line made to protect them. The Thin Blue Line Flag is flown as a matter of principle to show support for the thankless work that they do. Law enforcement often look on it as a reflection of courage and a tribute to those who have fallen in the line of duty.
